"The **Adagio in G minor** for <u>violin</u>, <u>strings</u>, and <u>organ continuo</u> is a <u>neo-Baroque</u> composition popularly attributed to the 18th-century Venetian master <u>Tomaso Albinoni</u>, but actually composed by 20th-century musicologist and Albinoni biographer <u>Remo Giazotto</u>, purportedly based on the discovery of a manuscript fragment by Albinoni. There is a continuing scholarly debate about whether the alleged fragment was real, or a <u>musical hoax</u> perpetrated by Giazotto, but there is no doubt about Giazotto's authorship of the remainder of the work."
